NAVAJO COUNTY, ARIZONA**

November 15, 2004

Supervisors' Chambers, Holbrook, Arizona – Time: 9:00a.m.

PRESENT: J.R. DeSpain, Chairman; Jerry Brownlow, Vice-Chairman; Percy Deal, Member; Jesse Thompson, Member; Pete Shumway, Member; James G. Jayne, County Manager; Lance Payette, Chief Deputy County Attorney; Kathy Hieb, Deputy Clerk of the Board. Mr. DeSpain led the Pledge of Allegiance and the Invocation.

CALL TO THE PUBLIC: There were no comments presented.

CONSENT AGENDA: 1) Voucher List for payment; 2) Assessments and Tax Roll corrections; 3) Back Tax Land Deed: Debra Swan; Wilburn D. & Jean K. Hickman; 4) Constable Reports: (October) Winslow #2; Snowflake #3; Pinetop #6; Show Low #5; Holbrook #1 (September/October); 5) Justice Court Reports: (October) Snowflake #3; Show Low #5; Winslow #2; (September) Holbrook #1; Winslow #2; Kayenta #4; Show Low #5; Pinetop #6; 6) Clerk of Superior Court Report: (October); 7) Juvenile Justice System Report: (October) **Mr. Thompson made a motion** to authorize the Chairman to sign the items in the Consent Agenda; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. (Mr. Deal absent for the vote)

NOVEMBER EMPLOYEE ANNIVERSARIES: 15 years: Frank Nagle, Beverly Wilson; **10 years:** Julio Gomez; **5 years:** Thomas Deridder, Don Ozment, Pamela Reid; **Certificates presented.**

WHITE MOUNTAIN LAKE RECREATION DISTRICT: John Hager, Vice-Chairman: **Board of Directors Session:** 1) **Accept resignation of Diana Siebolds and appoint new committee member Rose Alter to serve remaining two years of term:** **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to enter into a Board of Directors Session; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. (Mr. Deal absent for the vote) Mr. Hager advised that Ms. Siebolds was two years into her 4-year term and felt she did not have the time necessary to devote to the committee. Mr. Hager recommended that her resignation be accepted and that Rose Alter be appointed to fill the remainder of the term. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to accept the resignation of Diana Siebolds and appoint Rose Alter to fill the remaining two years of the term; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

2) **Appoint alternate committee members Ken Pringel & Barbara Karnath to 4-year terms:** Mr. Hager advised that two of the 4-year terms are expiring, and those persons have decided not to reapply. The recommendation is to appoint Ken Pringel and Barbara Karnath to the 4-year terms commencing on January 1, 2005. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to appoint Ken Pringel and Barbara Karnath to 4-year terms as presented; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

ELECTIONS: Kelly Dastrup, Elections Coordinator: Canvass of the 2004 General Election: Ms. Dastrup presented the official results for the 2004 General Election. **Mr. Thompson made a motion** to accept the Canvass of the 2004 General Election as presented; motion seconded by Mr. Deal; vote unanimous approving the motion.

NAVAJO COUNTY ASSESSOR: Cammy Darris, Assessor: Approve extension of temporary employee from November 19, 2004 to January 19, 2005, if needed: Ms. Darris explained that she needs this position at this time due to the number of deeds coming in from the Recorder's office, and address changes coming in from the Treasurer's office. She noted she has funds available from vacancy savings. **Mr. Thompson made a motion** to approve the extension of temporary employee from November 19, 2004 to January 19, 2004 if needed; motion seconded by Mr. Shumway; vote unanimous approving the motion.

WIA PROGRAM: Gail Sadler, Director: Approve Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA) with Arizona Department of Economic Security (DES) to execute new lease for office space in Show Low DES building for WIA staff: Ms. Sadler explained that Show Low DES is the recognized One Stop Center mandated as the approved center in Southern Navajo County to access employment opportunities through the Workforce Investment Act (WIA). This lease will increase space from one cubicle to two cubicles to allow adequate workspace for the youth and adult case managers. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to approve the IGA with ADES to execute new lease for office space in the Show Low DES building for WIA staff; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

NAVAJO COUNTY PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICES DISTRICT: Mary Tyler, Interim Director: **Board of Directors Session:** 1) West Nile Virus update: **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to enter into a Board of Directors Session; motion seconded by Mr. Deal; vote unanimous approving the motion. Ms. Tyler reported that to date, there have been 108 positive equine (horse) cases in Arizona, with 5 in Navajo County. There have been 96 positive avian (bird) cases in Arizona, with 5 in Navajo County. There were 249 positive mosquitoes in the state, with 10 in Navajo County (3 in Winslow; 1 in Polacca; 3 in Holbrook; 3 in Woodruff). Of the 387 human cases (with 10 deaths) reported in the state, there was one case (one death) in Navajo County. Ms. Tyler noted that because horse owners are more alert to the symptoms of West Nile Virus, many horses survived the season. **No action taken; informational only.**

2) Update on food establishment permits and fees collected: Ms. Tyler presented a summary as follows: Annual Permit Cost: Not Paid-\$130; Paid-\$35,875; Tax Exempt-\$7,665. Fees Received: Annual Fee-\$33,470; Pro-Rated fee-\$3495.30; Insufficient funds-\$50; Late fee-\$875. **No action taken; informational only. Mr. Shumway made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

PUBLIC WORKS: Dick Young, Deputy Director Engineering: 1) Accept filing of petition requesting establishment of Shumway Road as a County Highway and set Public Hearing for December 6, 2004 at 10:00 a.m.; and approve funding from District III & District IV Special Road Funds for right-of-way survey, title report and initial in-house construction: Noting that 10 signatures are necessary, Mr. Young presented petitions containing 29 signatures requesting the establishment of Shumway Road as a county highway. Mr. Young requested that the petitions be accepted and that this matter be set for public hearing on December 6, 2004. He also asked that funding in the amount not to exceed \$350,000 from District III & District IV Special Road Funds be approved for right-of-way survey, title report and initial

in-house construction. Mr. Payette noted that although we believe that a portion of Shumway Road was at some point declared a county highway, we do not have that paperwork. Therefore, we are moving to have the entire length of the road up to the State Land portion, declared a county highway. Mr. Young added that they will be doing a complete structural evaluation of the bridge so that it can be brought up to a 40-ton capacity. (currently only 10-ton capacity) **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to accept the petitions requesting establishment of Shumway Road as a county highway, and set a public hearing for December 6, 2004 @ 10:00 a.m.; and to approve the use of up to \$350,000 from District III & District IV Special Road funds for right-of-way survey, title report and initial in-house construction; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

2) Resolution extinguishing public easements affecting lots 28 & 29 in White Mountain Lakes Unit #8 (APN 204-30-121) as requested by Thomas L. & Adele Fink: At the request of Mr. Shumway and Mr. Brownlow, this item was continued to allow review by the White Mountain Lake Recreation District.

HUMAN RESOURCES: Gail Calisen, Director: Approval of Personnel Actions: Mr. Deal made a motion to approve the Personnel Actions as presented; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS: Kathy Hieb, Deputy Clerk of the Board: 1) Approval of Board meeting schedule for 2005: Ms. Hieb presented a proposed schedule for 2005 which would have the Board meetings on the second and fourth Mondays of each month. This schedule would avoid the necessity of having meetings on Tuesdays when there is a holiday. Mr. Deal noted that he has regular chapter meetings on the fourth Monday of each month, and it would be very difficult to change these meetings. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to approve the Board meeting schedule for 2005 as follows: Meetings will be held on the first and third Mondays of each month; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

2) Board Business: Mr. DeSpain advised that long time Navajo County employee, Doug Pogue, has passed away. Mr. Thompson stated that we need to decide on how to proceed with the TEA-21 issue.

3) Appointment of advisory committee to screen applicants for the Holbrook Justice of the Peace position: Ms. Calisen advised that the position closed on November 11th, and 14 applications were received. She noted that Human Resources would guide and direct the proceedings of the committee. Mr. DeSpain proposed the following persons to sit on the advisory committee: Bill Jeffers; Claudia Maestas; Clarence (C.J.) Wischman; Jeff Font; Lance Payette; John Lamb; Alfred Clark. Mr. DeSpain noted that he recommended John Lamb because he has developed the office over the years and would like to participate in the appointment. Mr. Deal expressed some concern with the current Justice of the Peace sitting on this committee. Mr. DeSpain disagreed, noting that many departments have come to this Board with recommendations for a successor to the director. He added that if there is no legal conflict, there should be no reason why Judge Lamb cannot sit on the committee. Mr. Deal responded that even if the judge has only one vote on the committee, he could still be a powerful presence. Following further discussion, it was determined that the committee would review all of the applications and return the top three applicants (in no particular order) to the Board for interviews. These names should be presented to the Board no later than December 6th. Ms. Calisen will facilitate the committee meetings with the help of Mr. DeSpain. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to approve the advisory committee as recommended;

with three names (unrated) to be submitted to the Board by December 6, 2004; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion.

NAVAJO COUNTY FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICT: Board of Directors Session: 1) Executive Session pursuant to ARS § 38-431.03(A)(4) for discussion or consultation with the Board's attorneys in order to consider the Board's position regarding the pending Winslow Levee flood litigation and related settlement discussions: **Mr. Brownlow made a motion** to enter into a Board of Directors Session; motion seconded by Mr. Shumway; vote unanimous approving the motion. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to enter into an Executive Session; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion. Present in the executive session were: Chairman J.R. DeSpain; Vice-Chairman Jerry Brownlow; Members Pete Shumway, Jesse Thompson, Percy Deal; Deputy County Attorney Lance Payette; County Manager James G. Jayne; Deputy Director Flood Control Tom Hieb; Deputy Clerk Kathy Hieb. **Mr. Thompson made a motion** to return to Board of Directors Session; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

2) Discussion and possible board action re: Approval of final settlement of Winslow Levee flood litigation: Mr. Payette explained that lawsuits were filed against the county following the floods in Winslow in 1993. After the trial, Navajo County was found to be 40% responsible for the damages. Both parties appealed the decision, and a settlement has now been reached. Funding for the settlement will come from Flood Control District funds, not the General Fund. Mr. Payette recommended approval of the settlement as outlined in the executive session, and he noted that the case will now be dismissed in the Court of Appeals. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to approve the settlement as outlined; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

BOARD OF SUPERVISORS/BOARD OF EQUALIZATION: Board of Equalization Session:
Petitions for Review of Notice of Change: **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to enter into a Board of Equalization Session; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. The Assessor Appraisers and petitioners were sworn by the Deputy Clerk. Norman Fish: APN 206-37-001Q: **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to uphold the Assessor's recommendation of no change; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. Michael B. Peddie: APN 212-09-108D: **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to lower the FCV to \$26,136 per recommendation of the Assessor; motion seconded by Mr. Thompson; vote unanimous approving the motion. (Mr. Brownlow declared a conflict and did not vote on this item as this petitioner is a relative) Michael & Kelly Kauss: APN206-41-289: **Mr. Thompson made a motion** to lower the FCV to \$157,097, per agreement; motion seconded by Mr. Shumway; vote unanimous approving the motion. William C. & Nelda L. Spradlin APN 209-25-011B: **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to lower the FCV to \$135,793, per agreement; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. Paul & Donna Lance APN 207-02-076: **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to lower the FCV to \$108,829, per agreement; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.
Petition for Review of Proposed Correction : Jim & Marilee Ervien: APN 103-30-020E: **Mr. Brownlow made a motion** to set the land value at \$6600; motion seconded by Mr. Deal; vote unanimous approving the motion. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

ADMINISTRATION: James Menlove, Finance Director: Authorization to enter into a contract to purchase new administrative computing software from New World Systems (NWS): Mr. Menlove began by explaining that the current software is inadequate for the county's needs, and is only available to finance staff. It is inaccessible by other departments and therefore, duplicate books are being kept. New World Systems is designed for government needs and is state of the art technology with a rich browser-based interface. Mr. Menlove noted that it will take 7 months to fully implement the system, but NWS will help up integrate and train personnel to use the system to the fullest extent possible. Mr. Menlove advised that while he did not do a formal Request for Proposal (RFP), he did do an extensive search for a vendor who would meet our needs. **Mr. Shumway made a motion** to enter into an executive session for legal advice, pursuant to ARS § 38-431.03 (A)(3); motion seconded by Mr. Deal; vote unanimous approving the motion. Present in the executive session were: Chairman J.R. DeSpain; Vice-Chairman Jerry Brownlow; Members Percy Deal, Jesse Thompson, Pete Shumway; Deputy County Attorney Lance Payette; County Manager James G. Jayne; Finance Director James Menlove; Accounting Supervisor Joan Mickle; Deputy Clerk Kathy Hieb. **Mr. Thompson made a motion** to return to regular session; motion seconded by Mr. Shumway; vote unanimous approving the motion. Mr. Menlove withdrew his proposal and will submit an RFP. This matter will be brought back to the Board on December 6, 2004. **Mr. Deal made a motion** to authorize the RFP for administrative computing software as presented; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion.

There being no further business to come before the Board of Supervisors, the meeting was adjourned until Monday, December 6, 2004, upon a **motion made by Mr. Shumway**; motion seconded by Mr. Brownlow; vote unanimous approving the motion. The meeting adjourned at 3:05 p.m.
